Age 75 years. Anne was born November 26, 1936 in Lake Village, AR the daughter of Frank and Mary Rallings. They both preceded her in death. Anne graduated from Saginaw High School in 1955. She then continued her higher education at Bay City Junior College (Delta College) where she met and later married Nathaniel Taylor in 1957. To this union was born three children, Trent Van, Toni Celeste, and Eric Van. Anne was a long term and dedicated member of Corinthian Baptist Church for more than 50 years. She served in the Senior Choir, the Gospel Chorus and she also served with the Mission Department visiting and praying with members of the church that were sick and shut in. Anne raised her children in church and taught Christian principles that they still practice. She was a loving and caring christian who walked the walk, not just talked the talk. Anne was a member of the United Sisters in Christ Organization and looked forward to attending their annual conference until failing health prevented participation. She was also an active member of the First Ward Community Grandparents Club, volunteering at VITA , and a tutor for Counsel

for Literacy. Anne was a dedicated and loving mother who did everything she could to encourage and motivate her children to strive for the best. As a single mother, Anne planned and achieved higher goals for her children. When asked how she achieved these goals, Anne always gave praises and thanks to God. She was a proud grandmother, even though she struggled with health restrictions, she was blessed to attend her oldest grandchild's graduation on May 20, 2012. Anne was employed by the Saginaw Postal Service for over 30 years. She was one of the first African American Females to serve in various positions including manager of CFS. Anne believed in fighting for what was right and did not hesitate to speak truth with eloquence and conviction.
