



Corinthian McGlothlin

March 14, 1903 - January 28, 2009

Friends may call at the Browne's Mortuary, 441 North Jefferson Avenue, on Monday from 2:00 until 8:00 p.m. Our beloved Corinthian McGlothlin passed away Wednesday, January 28, 2009 at the age of 105 years. He was born March 14, 1903 in Valley Park (Leland), MS to the late Judge and Callie McGlothlin. Mr. McGlothlin was inducted into the United States Army at Camp Shelby in Hattiesburg, MS on December 3, 1942 and received an honorable discharge on June 4, 1944. He moved to Saginaw, MI in 1944 with his wife Margaret, who preceded him in death in 1970. He was employed by Chevrolet Grey Iron where he worked 23 years before retiring in 1967. Mr. McGlothlin was a long standing member and staff at Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church. He married Josephine Hightower in 1971. She preceded him in death in 1976. He married Corean White McGlothlin in 1977 and remained devoted until her passing in 2005. Mr. McGlothlin joined Zion Missionary Baptist Church in 1993, where he continued to worship until his death. He was a lifelong member of the Perfect Ashler Lodge #25 A.F. & A. M., where he served in many capacities. He was a member of UAW Local 668, the Seniors Club, the Old Timers Club of the First Ward Community Center, and the NAACP where he served as an officer and lifelong member. Left to cherish his memory are two stepdaughters, Rosie L. Chandler and

Marie (Charlie) Jones; two granddaughters, Gwendolyn White Bowman and Kimberly (Melvin) Coleman of Lansing; two great-grandchildren, Marqus C. Coleman of Milledgeville, GA and Sheena L. Coleman of Lansing, MI; one goddaughter, Lorraine (Kenneth) Bond; many nieces, nephews, and very special friendships that include John Nichols, and the brothers of the Perfect Ashler Lodge #26 A.F. & A. M. Mr. McGlothlin was preceded in death by his parents, wife of 28 years, Corean White McGlothlin and one brother, I. L. McGlothlin.
