Funeral service will take place at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, March 30, 2012 at Browne's Mortuary, 441 North Jefferson Avenue. Rev. Absalom Smith will officiate. Mr. Layfield passed away Thursday, March 22, 2012 at the age of 81 years. He was born January 14, 1931 in Muscogee County, GA, the son of Jessie and Dudley Layfield, Sr. He relocated to Michigan in the 1950's. He retired from the Chevrolet Grey Iron Foundry after 42 years of service and was a member of U.A.W. Local 668. Mr. Layfield believed in God and was a dedicated father who raised his children to adulthood. He loved fishing, gardening and enjoyed visiting with family and friends in Georgia.
