Mr. Elijah Simon passed away Wednesday, February 13, 2008 at Covenant Medical Center in Saginaw, Michigan at the age of 53 years. Elijah was born August 16, 1954 in Saginaw, MI to Robert, Sr. and Carrie Lee (McCain) Simon. He attended Saginaw Public Schools and was a 1972 graduate of Saginaw High School. Elijah accepted Christ in his life and attended Jehovah Missionary Baptist Church in Sumter, SC. Elijah was especially well known in South Carolina. He loved his family and friends and listening to gospel music, especially by Shirley Caesar.
