Jefferson Avenue. Sunrise took place on September 27, 1948 in Buffalo, NY. Sunset took place on April 8, 2007. She was born to Robert Smith and Lucille Louise Phillips. Jackie confessed Christ at an early age at Macedonia Baptist Church in Buffalo, NY under the leadership of the late Rev. Robert Sanders. She was a faithful and active member until she went away to college at Wilberforce University, Wilberforce, OH, where she graduated with a degree in Sociology. She later attended Ohio State University in Columbus, OH where she received a Master's Degree in Social Work. Following graduation, she worked as a Drug Counselor in Columbus, OH. In 1974, she relocated to Saginaw, MI where she was employed by the Department of Social Services. In August of 1974, she was hired as a School Social Worker in Saginaw Public Schools. Due to district lay-offs Jackie was employed by the Veterans Administration Hospital for four years, returning to Saginaw Public Schools in 1985 until present. She consistently maintained the largest parent group in the district's Parenting That Works Program. Jackie was also employed as a consultant for Saginaw Psychological Services from 1991 until present. Jackie's community involvement included: supporter of the

YMCA Strong Kids Campaign, FYI (Family Youth Initiative) mentor for Holy Communion Gospel Center's Safe House, member of the Recreational Commission of Buena Vista Township, former board member for the Underground Railroad and former part-time instructor of Delta College, Ricker Campus. Jackie's religious involvement included teaching Sunday School at Rosehill Missionary Baptist Church and Williams Temple C.O.G.I.C. In 2003, she united with Mt. Olive Baptist Church under the leadership of Rev. Marvin T. Smith where she was a member of the Epsilon Flock Ministry and the Contribution Ministry. She also regularly attended Bible Study and Sunday School and was very jubilant in her praise. Jackie was an avid physical fitness advocate and participant, participating in numerous marathons, including the Bobby Crimm Race. She was a member of the Saginaw YMCA and of the Detroit-area Race Walking Club. Jackie leaves to cherish her memory, a loving daughter, Kizzy K. Taylor of Lithonia, GA; her former husband and devoted friend, Roger L. Taylor; three sisters, Willa Mae Schultz, Sharon Ann (David) Hull and Gwendolyn Smith all of Buffalo, NY; three brothers, John (Mary) Phillips, James (Everdean) Phillips and Robert "Dewayne" Smith, Buffalo, NY; special aunt, Daisy Mae Harris, Buffalo, NY; six godchildren, Khary (Jennifer) Bridgewater, Marlo Brown, Vivian McKinley, Jonathon, DeVonn and Alexander Rutledge; one sister-in-law, Eva (Randy) VanHook; one brother-in-law, Sam Taylor; very dear and lifetime friends, Mary and Thomas Bridgewater; godmother, Mary McCormick.
