Funeral service will take place at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, September 15, 2007 at Corinthian Baptist Church, 104 South 10th Street. Pastor Roy Manning will officiate with interment in Forest Lawn Cemetery. James 1:12 James was a humble man whose life was filled with honor and integrity. His life exemplified his abiding love and faith in God and respect for everyone. The beloved husband of Victoria Monroe, father, grandfather, uncle, cousin, and brother received the greater victory of the Lord on Saturday, September 8, 2007 at the age of 63 years. After a lengthy illness, his spirit was set free. James was born on January 18, 1944 in Quitman, LA to McDonald and Odessa Monroe. At an early age, he accepted Christ and joined Bethany Baptist Church in Quitman, LA. James was a faithful member of Corinthian Missionary Baptist Church in Saginaw, MI, where he served as a trustee. He attended Jackson High School in Jonesboro, LA. He was a graduate of Grambling State University where he earned his teaching degree. James taught four years in Louisiana. After moving to Saginaw in 1969, he attended Central Michigan, Michigan State, and Saginaw Valley Universities. He taught two years at Central Middle School, a combination of 14 years teaching Night School, Adult Education,

OIC, and 21 and a half years at Arthur Hill High School where he retired in 1999. James loved children and teaching; he challenged his students to always endeavor to do their best. James' favorite hobby was playing basketball and attending high school basketball games. He had a special lasting friendship with the men on his team.
