pouurer, trainer and welder at the Chevrolet Grey Iron Foundry for 25 years. He

September 3, 1956. To this union, five children were born: JoeAnne Jackson,
Mary Sue Hannibal, Hattie (Terrell) Shepard, Catherine Jackson and Lucius
Mayfield, Jr., all of Saginaw, Mich. and adopted son, Emmanuel Mose
