Barrett, Jr. departed this life on December 21, 2011 at the age of 92 years. Luther was born on December 11, 1919 in Nacogdoches, Texas. He was the son of Luther J. Barrett, Sr. and Mary L. Barrett (Borders). The first part of Luther's life was spent in Wichita Falls, Texas, where he received his education at Booker T. Washington high school and later became a Tailor. In 1942, he moved to Oakland, California where he met and married the love of his life, Julia D. Jones. He later joined the United States Army and was honorably discharged as a World War II veteran. After returning to the states, and three children later, Luther and Julia moved to Saginaw, Michigan. He soon began working for General Motors in Saginaw, Michigan and retired after 30 years of service. Luther enjoyed refurbishing cars, traveling and helping people. He will be greatly missed by all who knew him. Luther leaves to cherish his memory, his loving wife of 68 years, Julia Barrett; two daughters, Andrea Rowe of North Chicago, Illinois and Kathleen (Wendell) Rodgers of Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina; and one son, Gregory (Evelyn) Barrett of Olongapo, Philippines. Also cherishing his memory are many grandchildren, great-grandchildren, and a host of relatives and friends.
