She was born August 14, 1943 in Steele, Missouri to Willie and Theodosia Wright. Her parents preceded her in death. The Wright family came to settle in Saginaw, Michigan and Mary A. Scott graduated from Saginaw High School in 1961. She furthered her education at Delta Community College, then continued at Central Michigan University where she earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Education in 1965, and later received a Master of Arts. Mrs. Mary A. Scott was a minister and church mother at Center of Attraction Fellowship. She worked in the Saginaw Public Schools for forty years as a teacher and a counselor, most recently at Webber Middle School. In recent years, she was deeply involved in the Saginaw Education Association. Over the years, she was a member of a number of organizations and supported many area churches. She leaves to cherish her memory two loving daughters, MarShondra (David) Lawrence and Donya Scott, and a beloved granddaughter, Kendall Scott. She also leaves brother, Martin (Dorothy) Wright, sister, Annie Pearl Wright, brother, John Wright, all of Saginaw, and brother, Lester (Katie) Wright of San Antonio, Texas, along with
