"A Different Kind of Iron" Life Portrait of Pastor Eugene Smith, Sr. Beloved Pastor, Father, Grandfather, Brother, Uncle and Friend, Pastor Eugene Smith, transitioned from this life to life eternal on Tuesday, September 12, 2006 at the Auburn Care Center surrounded by his loving children. Pastor Smith was born 81 years ago on May 19, 1925, to the late Thomas and Ethel Smith. He was joined in holy matrimony to his soul mate, Amida Siler, on August 2, 1958. She preceded him in death. God blessed this union with five children. Pastor Smith served in the U. S Army during World War II earning four Bronze Stars along with numerous other medals of honor. He founded the Temple of God Church of God In Christ in 1987. He was a Pastor after God's own heart. He endeared himself to the work of the ministry for 19 years. He retired from GM Malleable Iron as a truck driver after thirty-nine years of service and was a member of UAW Local 455. He was a different kind of iron. (A man blessed.)
