January 11, 1932 - October 15, 2007

Friends may call at the Browne's Mortuary, 441 North Jefferson Avenue on Sunday from 2:00 until 8:00 p.m. Samuel Glenn Bowman, Sr. was born January 11, 1932 in Judsonia, Arkansas to Thaddeus and Mabel Bowman. Being the only child that they conceived to survive beyond the age of three, Sam was the apple of his beloved mother's eyes and source of pride to his devoted father. Samuel was educated in the Saginaw public schools. He was defensive tackle for Saginaw High and a member of their oratorical team. Sam was a graduate of the class of 1950. On October 1, 1952, Samuel married Mary Louise Hawkins. Both Samuel and Mary spent the early part of their union separated while Samuel served his country in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict. Once honorably discharged from his duties, Samuel returned home to begin a life with Mary. Together they spent many happy years raising two sons and one daughter. Samuel was employed with the Malleable Iron plant for 27 years. He retired March 1, 1988. Sam spent much of his retirement enjoying his two greatest passions - fishing and gardening. He'd spend many early morning hours out on the water casting fishing lines with faithful friends, Murphy Layton, Tommy Scott and family members. He would sit for hours catching the limit (or going over the limit allowed) of crappies. He frequently fished from sun up to sundown because

he loved the tranquility that came from being on the water. His gift of gardening was enjoyed by many who knew him, because Sam routinely planted more than he needed. Perhaps the only thing he enjoyed more than watching his garden grow was seeing others reaping what he sowed. Although he would not often admit to his declining health, family members knew that Sam was ill when he could no longer fish or garden. On December 22, 1997, Mary preceded him in death. Just eight months prior, both he and Mary suffered the loss of their son, Mark. On September 26, 1998, Sam was united in marriage to Dorothy Perry. They enjoyed many happy days entertaining family and friends in their home, traveling, attending church functions and hosting holiday dinners. Over the last two years, Sam battled a series of health conditions that left him lethargic and weakened, however, he never complained. Instead, he quietly accepted his lot in life and enjoyed what health he had left. Grateful to God for what remained, Sam was still able to enjoy barbecuing, cooking and watching westerns on television. Samuel was a devoted member of Tabernacle Baptist Church where he served as chairman of the Deacon Board, a member of the Layman Board and Superintendent of Sunday School. He faithfully attended 8:00 a.m. worship service, weekly Bible study, revivals and afternoon programs. He was a supporter of the total church, even when his health wasn't the best. Sam went from labor to rest on Monday, October 15, 2007. He leaves to cherish his memory, his loving wife, Dorothy; one son, Samuel Jr. (Noreen) and one daughter, Lynaire (Zachary) Clipper; one stepson, Dennis (Vanessa) Perry; two stepdaughters, Gwen and Carolyn Perry; 15 grandchildren, Mark Tekorey, Zanita Mae, Zachary II, David Lee Pritchett, Jr., Forrest Pritchett, Mary Louise, Deonta, Tiffany, John, Quentin, Keaira, Anthony, Darius, Zaria and Zamillya; one sister-in-law, Florence Brown of Marion, Arkansas; one brother-in-law, Arthur (Alice) Washington of Dolten, Illinois and a host of other relatives and friends. Samuel will be sorely missed by all that knew him.
